HOUSTON TEACHERS HONORED WITH THE KINDER EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AWARD AND A COLLECTIVE \$240,000 IN GRANTS

HOUSTON – October 1, 2015 – Twelve (12) school teachers were honored recently with the Kinder Excellence in Teaching Award receiving a collective total of \$240,000 from the <u>Kinder Foundation</u>. Five teachers each from KIPP Houston Public Schools and YES Prep Public Schools, and two teachers from the Catholic Schools of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston received grants of \$20,000 each. Five of these decorated teachers are also Teach for America alumni.

The Kinder Excellence in Teaching Award was established in honor of Edna C. Kinder, who taught special education students in Cape Girardeau, MO. Her son, Rich Kinder, co-founder and executive chairman of Kinder Morgan, and his wife Nancy, created the awards to recognize innovative and results-oriented teaching and to raise public awareness of the importance of effective and committed teachers.
