TWELVE HOUSTON EDUCATORS RECEIVE PRESTIGIOUS KINDER EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AWARD

Top educators from KIPP Texas Public Schools – Houston, YES Prep Public Schools, Catholic Schools of the Archdiocese of Galveston – Houston, and Teach For America Houston granted gifts of recognition totaling \$300,000

HOUSTON – September 25, 2023 – Twelve (12) Houston-area school teachers were recently honored with the annual Kinder Excellence in Teaching Award and a gift of \$25,000 each from Kinder Foundation. In total, \$300,000 was granted to teachers from KIPP Texas Public Schools – Houston, YES Prep Public Schools, Catholic Schools of the Archdiocese of Galveston – Houston, and Teach for America Houston. Each recipient was nominated by their school leader or school director, has taught at the same network or school for at least three years, is a positive motivator to students and faculty, and has led students to academic growth.

"It is an honor and delight to recognize some of Houston's great educators every year with the Kinder Excellence in Teaching Awards. Every student deserves to have a teacher who cares about their success, and these 12 teachers go above and beyond to ensure their students succeed. We hope this recognition and financial award will serve to highlight their outstanding commitment to teaching," said Nancy Kinder, President and CEO of the Kinder Foundation.

The Kinder Excellence in Teaching Awards (KETA) has awarded over \$4.8 million in grants to more than 299 teachers since the program was established in 2001. The program was created in honor of Rich Kinder's mother, Edna C. Kinder, who taught special education students for many years in Cape Girardeau, Missouri.
